

# EXPANDING ENLOE

## ENLOE MEDICAL CENTER'S EXPANSION PROJECT UPDATE

*The Enloe Century Project will transform Enloe Medical Center, providing a more comfortable environment and additional space to care for the people of our community for generations to come.*

The expansion will double the size of the medical center, adding 191,000 square feet of space. The new tower will offer 140 new rooms, providing a total of 233 private rooms at the Esplanade campus.

◆ **The Magnolia Tower, a five-story patient building with a Mediterranean façade (Opens 2012)**

- Two new Intensive Care Units with 12 beds each for cardiovascular and neuro-trauma patients
- The Nettleton Mother & Baby Care Center, on the fourth floor, offering private rooms with private bathrooms
- Larger medical-surgical units
- New main entrance with a reception area, lounge, garden café, gift shop and meditation room
- A comfortable family lounge on each upper floor with refreshment area
- Separate elevators for patients and the public
- Employee lounges with lockers on each floor

◆ **New Surgery Center (Opens 2012)**

- Doubles the number of existing surgery suites
- Dedicated heart, neurological and orthopedic operating rooms
- Two private surgery consultation rooms for physicians to meet with patients and families
- Separate street entrance, reception area and lounge

◆ **New Emergency Center (Completion date pending)**

- Triples the size of the Emergency Department
- Dedicated X-ray and CT-scan
- Separate street entrance, reception area and lounge

◆ **Parking structure (Opened August 2008)**

- Expanded patient and visitor parking along 5th Avenue

◆ **A park just west of the new tower (Completion date pending)**
